KENTON ELKS RITUAL TEAM MAKES HISTORY!

The Kenton Elks 157 ritual team represented the State Of Ohio Elks Association having competed on July 1st in the preliminary rounds of competition placing 1st in the Eastern Division and taking the highest score overall in the United States. The top four, two from the eastern division and two from the western division, competed on Monday July 3rd. On Tuesday awards were announced and Kenton Elks found they were 1st in the nation and making history. Kenton was the first team to win 4 national championships in a row having tied the record last year in Atlanta. The last lodge to hold the most consecutive wins was Newton Massachusetts who won in 1933, 1934, and 1935. The win in Minneapolis gives Kenton it's 5th win in the National Ritualistic Competition with their first win coming in 2006. With their fifth win they are one win away from tying the lodge with the most championships, Greely Colorado who has six wins.

Several members from the Elks Lodge won individual awards in their performing chair. Winning All Americans which is highest score for their position in the East were Ryan Yoakum as Leading Knight, Derryck Menard as Loyal Knight, Marty McKinley Gray as Lecturing Knight, Jeff Buroker as Chaplain, Sue Buroker as candidate, and coaches Jack Buroker, John Hines, Todd Daquino, David Beazley and Jerry Haudenschield. Also winning the Rush Holland Award for being the highest scoring Leading Knight was Ryan Yoakum and winning highest score overall in the East and presented with the William A. King Award was Derryck Menard. Also competing and receiving highest score in their respective chairs but ineligible for awards for having competed previously were Chad Spencer as Exalted Ruler, Stacey Hamilton-Davis as Esquire, and Julie Crowe as Inner Guard.

Two individuals from the Kenton Lodge also competed in individual contests. In the 11 o'clock Toast Past Exalted Ruler Todd Daquino finished 3rd overall and Past Exalted Ruler Chad Spencer finished 2nd overall in the Flag Charge.

So, some of the miscommunication that is still going around at the Elk Lodges about ENF.

Myth: "\$10.00 for 10 years" was a slogan being passed around when I became a Kenton Elk 25 years ago. While it was considered good then, it won't make things last today. Look at what \$100.00 would buy back then and compare it to what can be bought today, there is no comparison.

Myth: "The Elks are the 2nd largest scholarship giver in the USA. Only the Federal Government gives more scholarships". There are many Companies and Organizations that give billions of dollars in scholarships annually. The Elks do give many scholarships and legacy scholarships to its members and local communities members.

ENF grants that have been awarded so far this year to: Our lodge - \$8,500.00; Our Northwest District #6920 - \$27,500.00; Our Ohio State - \$462,500.00 plus ENF has given grants to support our State major project (CP) and ENF programs of \$486,660.00. These numbers are all because of you, plain and simple. Your giving makes this happen here in Ohio, our Northwest District and our Lodge.

The new GER has set a goal of \$4.80 this year, same as last year. At years end in 2022-2023, we had donated over \$8.00 per member. Congratulations on your achievement! This allowed us to apply for grants equal to \$13,500.00 to be used in our communities. As of July 9th 2023, our average is \$2.997 per member. We have met two of the three goals to increase our Gratitude Grant and raised it \$1,000.00. We just need more members to give \$10.00 or more and we'll be able to get another \$500.00. Can you help us out?
