A LITTLE NOTE FROM ENF FUNDRAISING CHAIR

Did I hear you say you had a BIRTHDAY coming up during this 2023–2024 ENF Fiscal Year? Let others help you celebrate it by you signing up on Facebook and have them donate to your favorite charity, The Elks National Foundation (pronounced "Thee" Elks National Foundation much like "Thee" Ohio State Buckeyes) ("the" followed by a vowel=thee) (ya know that English stuff taght ya some years back).

Following excerpt from the ENF Frontline Newsletter in October: <u>Gratitude Grants</u> are the ENF's way of thanking Lodges that meet the Grand Exalted Ruler's <u>per-member-giving goal</u> for the ENF. While these grants have a base value of \$2,000, bonuses for Fidelity Club participation, membership support, and excellence in the Chair Challenge were previously able to bring the total up to \$3,500. But that wasn't enough.

To thank our donors and build even stronger communities, we are adding a fourth bonus for next year's Gratitude Grants! This bonus also will be worth \$500, bringing the possible total up to \$4,000—double the base value of the grant. To attain this bonus, Lodges must increase their fundraising over the previous year by 10 percent. How much did Kenton Elks Lodge #157 donate last year? \$4857.51 or \$8.26 per member. We were excellent. Congratulations.

So, where are we at right now with our donations? We've donated \$2144.00. Our per member giving is at \$3.795. We have 14.34% membership contributing to ENF. And the Chair Challenge points have already exceeded the 550 points required. So, we're getting close. Oh, by the way, because of your giving to the ENF last year, Kenton Lodge has applied for and received \$8,500.00 plus has another grant pending for \$4,000.00. Pretty good return on our investment for our community, don't you think? Check out the new poster info. in the Trophy Room.
